Department of Innovation, Industry, Science and Research: International Science Linkages – French Australian Science and Technology (FAST) Program Round 8

Internal closing date: 5 March 2010

External closing date: 12 March 2010

The FAST program was established by the Australian Government and the government of the Republic of France to provide support for the promotion and facilitation of scientific and technological collaboration between Australian and French researchers. Grants are available to Australian organisations from both private and public sectors for new joint collaborative research projects which draw on complementary strengths in both countries and which meet the objectives of the ISL program. The FAST Program is a bilateral fund and applicants must apply for funding to support collaboration between Australian and French partners. The lead organisation from each country must submit an application to their respective government. In the 2010 Round 8, the Australian and French governments have identified a number of priority areas for collaborative research:

- Life sciences (including medical and health sciences);
- Environmental science; and
- Energy

The FAST Program is a travel fund, therefore applicants may request support up to AUD\$22,000 for international travel and living expenses to and within France for Australia-based researchers directly involved in the project. Projects may range from short international visits to more complex projects. Projects under Round 8 cannot extend beyond 24 December 2011. Please note that prior to applying online, applicants must be registered with the ISL system.

The Australian Dental Research Foundation invites application from clinicians and qualified researchers interested in undertaking a dental research project in Australia. Grants between \$5,000 and \$10,000 are available for one year for materials, consumables, minor equipment (up to \$1,000), specified contract services and other specified expenses related to the project. Requests for salary support will not be considered.

Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists – 2011 Research Grants Program

Internal closing date: 25 March 2010

External closing date: 1 April 2010

The ANZCA supports and promotes research in anaesthesia, intensive care, pain medicine and related sciences and branches of medicine. Applications are open for 2011 research grants.

Novice Investigator Grant - awarded to support scientific investigations proposed by novice investigators who have not been awarded a peer-reviewed research grant in the past and do not have an experienced investigator as a co-investigator or associate investigator on the proposed grant. Eligible applicants must be fellows and registered trainees of ANZCA, JFICM and/or FPM and must have a certified ongoing appointment in Australia, New Zealand, Hong Kong, Malaysia or Singapore. AUD\$20,000 is available for funding of one year. Please note that requests for equipment costing \$10,000 or more must be accompanied by a written quotation. Applications for supplementary funding of existing grants will not be accepted.

Project Grants – support scientific investigations proposed by Fellows of ANZCA, JFICM and/or FPM and their research collaborators and have objectives in line with the research interests of ANZCA. The maximum amount available for a Project Grant is AUD\$60,000 per year.

Scholarship Grants are made *within* the Project Grants scheme. The Fellow or Registered Trainee seeking scholarship support must be the chief investigator or one of a group of chief investigators seeking support for a research project, a Fellow or Trainee of ANZCA or FPM, enrolled in a higher degree (PhD or MD) and be working full time on the research (0.8 FTE or more). The maximum amount available for a Project Grant that

includes a Scholarship Grant is \$80,000 per year, \$40,000 of which supports the salary of the Scholarship recipient. Scholarships are funded for 3 years.

Academic Enhancement Grants - awarded to an individual with an academic appointment, or an academic institution, for the support of a program of scientific investigation proposed by one of the academic staff at that institution. Applications for Academic Enhancement Grants are accepted from Chief Investigators who are resident in Australia, New Zealand, Hong Kong, Malaysia and/or Singapore, and who hold ANZCA, JFICM and/or FPM Fellowships **ONLY**. The maximum funding amount is AUD\$90,000, which will be made available in one year, but may be apportioned in the budget over more than one year.

Roche Organ Transplantation Research Foundation – Letter of Intent: Research Grants

Internal closing date: 25 March 2010

External closing date: 1 April 2010

The ROTRF supports important and innovative research projects relevant to solid organ transplantation, particularly where there is an unmet medical need. Priority support is given to research which uses either human organ transplant material and/or experimental models which simulate pathological states and mechanisms operating in human organ transplantation. Whilst the ROTRF/JDFR joint grant will not be offered this year, the ROTRF remains committed to its mission of supporting research relevant to organ transplantation also applied to the diabetes area. To be considered for a grant award, applications should have demonstrable applicability to human organ transplantation. Established faculty members of academic staff at universities, transplant centres and research institutions are eligible to apply. The maximum amount awarded per grant is 300,000 Swiss Francs distributed over 3 years.

Heart Foundation – Career Development, Overseas and Postdoctoral Fellowships

*****(Inc National Stroke Foundation and Indigenous Health)***

Internal closing date: 31 March 2010

External closing date: 12 April 2010

Applications are now open for Heart Foundation Fellowships, offered to early career scientists who propose to engage in biomedical, clinical and/or public health (including health services) research related to cardiovascular disease and related disorders. The research supported by the fellowship must be carried out in Australia. Fellows must be Australian or New Zealand citizens or hold a Special Category Visa.

Postdoctoral Research Fellowships – available to medical and science graduates who have completed a MD or PhD within the last five years. Individuals who are engaged in cardiovascular research overseas may apply for a fellowship to return to Australia to continue their research at an Australian institute. Postdoctoral Research Fellowships are tenable for up to two years and may be full time or part time. There are two categories of seniority: 0-2 and 2-5 years postdoctoral.

Overseas Fellowships – available to medical and science graduates who have completed a PhD or MD within the last 24 months and have at least two years of cardiovascular research experience. Applicants who have already planned/taken up a postdoctoral position overseas may also apply, provided they are within 12 months of the commencement of the position at the time of application. Overseas Fellowships are tenable for three years, of which the first two will be spent overseas and the third in Australia.

Career Development Fellowships – provide support to develop the career of scientists who are 2-12 year postdoctoral and have spent at least two years actively contributing to cardiovascular research in Australia. Career Development Fellowships are tenable for four years and may be full time or part time. There are two categories of seniority: 2-7 and 7-12 years postdoctoral.

Diabetes Australia Research Trust – 2011/2012 Grants

*****(Inc Millennium Awards, Viertel Postdoctoral Fellowships and one-year research grants)***

Internal closing date: 23 April 2010

External closing date: 30 April 2010

Applications are invited for 2011 diabetes research projects. Along with basic scientific and clinical research, applications relating to research into diabetes within remote and rural, culturally diverse and Indigenous communities are also invited. Three types of grant categories will be funded in 2011:

Millennium Awards – The two Awards of up to \$150,000 are each granted over two years. Only one application in an Award category will be considered from each researcher:

Type 1 Millennium Award is made available for research into Type 1 diabetes including the following priority areas

- Modulation of the immune system
- Beta cell replacement / islet transplantation
- Genetic engineering / gene therapy
- Hypoglycaemia
- Complications (Retinopathy, Neuropathy, Nephropathy)

Type 2 Underworks Millennium Award is available for research into Type 2 diabetes including the following priority areas

- Insulin secretion and action
- Insulin resistance
- Complications

Viertel Postdoctoral Fellowship in Diabetes – This fellowship is valued at \$300,000 over two years.

Funding is to provide support to post-doctoral researchers with 2-3 years experience and covers the research fellow's salary, as well as consumables used in the project and a research assistant. This fellowship is made available for research into diabetes that **will benefit an aging population**.

One year DART research grants – DART grants of up to \$60,000 will be awarded to provide for basic, clinical or applied research within the following areas:

- Biochemistry, physiology and pathology
- Nutrition
- Epidemiology
- Psychology
- Foot care
- Education research
- Health care and delivery
